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Academic Trends, Student Growth & Demographics

NWEA Data

Cohort data demonstrated that 88% of students who have been in the program three or more years achieved typical growth in reading, math, and language as demonstrated on the NWEA Measure of Academic Progress. 45% of that same cohort achieved greater than typical growth. This evidence indicates that students who remain in the program advance within the norm group percentile rankings.

WIDA Data

2019- 43.3% of students taking WIDA scored a 4.5 or higher in at least one subcategory

2020- 49.8% of students taking WIDA scores a 4.5 or higher in at least one subcategory
